On Tuesday we opened our COVID-19 vaccination phone line and website portal, and once again, we experienced a great amount of traffic. This week we received nearly 5,900 doses from the state and within a short period of time, we had booked all of our available vaccination appointments. I continue to ask for your patience, as demand is much greater than our supply.

On that note, I want you to know that we are working diligently to increase the amount of COVID-19 vaccines we receive so our potential is not limited. Last Friday, <u>I sent a letter</u> to President Joe Biden asking for 50,000 doses every week so we can vaccinate 40 percent of our population. I am confident Macomb County could administer these doses and be a leader in President Biden's ambitious effort to protect our citizens. We will keep advocating for these resources to ensure the health and safety of our community and I will continue to keep you updated on our efforts. But again, we appreciate your patience as we navigate this issue.

- To help families affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, more than 1.2 million people
 in Michigan who are eligible for food assistance benefits will receive an additional
 payment by the end of January. The payment raises their monthly amount by 15
 percent. The 15 percent increase in Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program
 (SNAP) benefits is for six months, ending in June. Learn more.

Michiganders eligible for food assistance benefits will receive a **15% increase in benefits for six months** (January to June).

January benefits will be loaded to Bridge Cards between January 20 to January 30 as a separate payment from the assistance that was provided earlier in the month.

Eligible families do not need to re-apply to receive the additional benefits. After January, the **15% increase will be added to Bridge Cards by the end of each month.**
