Good morning,

In the last few weeks, I've made it clear that local senior citizens are a priority for Macomb County when determining our COVID-19 vaccination strategy. We know that seniors are a vulnerable population who are at-risk for infection and our goal is to ensure their health and safety.

With this in mind, we've recently launched a partnership with Meijer that allows their pharmacies to distribute COVID-19 vaccines. We've also worked with SMART and Richmond/Lenox EMS to create a drive-through vaccination site for individuals aged 65 and up. We will continue to look for opportunities that help us protect our seniors, and as I have said before, we will keep working to increase our supply of vaccines so that we can meet demand. So far we have administered 39,228 doses. We've also received positive feedback from countless individuals who have been to our vaccination site, including:

Important Things to Know

Macomb County has partnered with SMART and Richmond/Lenox EMS to expand its drivethrough vaccine program to any resident aged 65 or above. Interested seniors should call the SMART Macomb Vaccine Hotline at 586-421-6579 to register for the county wait list between the hours of 3 p.m. – 7 p.m. Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. – 1 p.m. Saturdays, and 9 a.m. – 1 p.m. Sundays. Seniors can also email the SMART Macomb Vaccine Hotline 24/7 at macombvaccine@smartbus.org and include their name, address, phone number and date of birth. Macomb County will contact individuals from the wait list as appointments become available.

Seniors are also encouraged to register for COVID-19 vaccine appointments through other Macomb County locations:

- In partnership with the Macomb County Health Department, Meijer Pharmacy is
 registering individuals and reaching out to make appointments at one of several
 Macomb County stores. To register, individuals can text COVID to 75049, go online
 or simply visit a local Meijer pharmacy and ask to register.
- Rite Aid Pharmacy is also registering individuals who are aged 65 and above and will contact those who are currently eligible based on availability of the vaccine. To register for an appointment, **click here**.

Can people with a history of allergic reactions get the vaccine?

Most people who have food or environmental allergies can still get the vaccine. Prior to getting vaccinated, talk to your health care provider if you have had any severe reactions to medicines or vaccines in the past.

The Michigan Department of Attorney General is <u>warning Michigan residents</u> to beware of rental assistance scams. Follow these tips to avoid becoming a victim of a scam:

- Never give your bank account, debit card, credit card or Social Security numbers to anyone who contacts you without first independently verifying that person's identity.
- Do your research on any organization that requests personal information or money.
- Investigate the company you are considering using online with the words 'scam', 'fraud', or 'complaint' to see what others are saying. Do this prior to making contact.
- If you think you may have been a victim of any fraud, <u>contact the Attorney</u>
 <u>General's Office</u>. To report fraud or file a general consumer complaint, contact the
 Attorney General's Consumer Protection team. <u>Filing a complaint online</u> is the
 best way to make your connection to Consumer Protection and provide a


comprehensive report to the Attorney General's office to ensure investigators have the information they need. If a consumer is unable to fill out an online complaint, they can call the toll-free Consumer Protection hotline at 877-765-8388 and staff will provide a hard copy form to fill out and return.
