On May 7 we will begin to see some local industries resume activities that present a very low risk of COVID-19 infection, including construction, real-estate and work that is traditionally and primarily performed outdoors. This is the result of an executive order from Governor Whitmer, and it is made possible by all of us doing our part to reduce the spread of coronavirus. Whether this be wearing a mask or practicing social distancing in public, our efforts are paying off and we are one step closer to fully re-engaging our economy.

In the interim, know that Macomb County is working hard to ensure our communities are ready to reopen. For instance, our Department of Roads is starting several major infrastructure projects, our Office of Public Works has inspectors out in the field and our Department of Planning and Economic Development has counseled more than 1,100 local businesses. This will hopefully enable a smooth transition once restrictions are lifted or relaxed over the next few weeks and months. The process won't be easy, and there's still work to do, but if we are smart and if we work together, we will get back on track.


Important Things to Know
