Today I announced a new round of grants to help local businesses that were impacted by COVID-19 and the shutdown. Up to \$5 million is on the table for organizations with more than 50 employees. The application is open at MacombBusiness.com now through July 22. Please take a look and share with your community.

Now, we've already made significant progress in this arena. Our first grant cycle, which launched in June, will distribute close to \$20 million to small businesses. And that's just the beginning. When Macomb County announced its receipt of \$152 million in federal CARES Act funding, we committed \$70 million to the Macomb County CARES for Small Business Program, an initiative focused on PPE kit distribution, grants and a variety of efforts to prepare organizations for safe opening operations and future emergency preparedness needs. Our goal is to aid in recovery in any way we can. So stay tuned to MacombGov.org for future announcements and updates.

In closing, and as I've said before - Macomb County is here to help. So whether you are a business wanting to get your employees tested for COVID-19, a family experiencing a financial crisis or an individual dealing with mental health issues, we can provide support. The drive-thru, minimal contact site in Mount Clemens is open on weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 5 p.m. The test is free, no prescription is needed and you need not have symptoms to be tested.
