Last week, Governor Whitmer issued a new executive order that requires individuals to wear masks in indoor spaces and crowded outdoor areas. It also requires businesses that are open to the public to refuse entry or service to people not wearing a face covering, with limited exceptions. These orders took effect Monday and yesterday, I shared a clarifying statement for Macomb County businesses and residents:

- If a business needs help with a customer who refuses to wear a mask, they should call their local police department (which might include the Macomb County Sheriff's Office).
- 2. If a consumer has a general complaint about compliance, they should call the Michigan Department of Health & Human Services at 1-888-535-6136 or visit michigan.gov/coronavirus for more information.

The country is currently seeing a rise in COVID-19 cases. By wearing a mask or face covering, you can protect yourself and others from the virus. Please help us keep our community safe by following this guidance.


