Macomb County is offering COVID-19 testing for all residents. To make an appointment for yourself or a group of employees, call the Macomb County Health Department 586-463-3750 Monday through Friday 8:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. The drive-thru, minimal contact site in Mount Clemens is open on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. The test is free, no prescription is needed and you need not have symptoms to be tested.

Grants, free Back-to-Business kits with basic PPE and other resources for reopening your business are available through Macomb County Planning & Economic Development. Visit MacombBusiness.com.

- To combat the rise in COVID-19 cases, it is important to wear a mask and get tested for the virus. Macomb County is offering free testing to residents. No prescriptions or symptoms are required. Call the Macomb County Health Department at 586-463-3750 Monday through Friday 8:30 a.m. - 5 p.m. to make an appointment.
- Macomb County Veterans Services will provide free dental exams to local veterans
 without dental insurance on August 12 and August 17. Service will be provided by
 MyCare Health Center (6900 E. Ten Mile Road, Centerline), where individuals can
 receive a comprehensive exam by a dentist, full mouth x-rays, a dental cleaning or full
 mouth debridement and a health screening. For questions, information on eligibility or
 to schedule an appointment, call 586-469-5315.





- The deadline to participate in the 2020 Census has been extended through October 31. If you haven't already, please fill out your form now. Census data is used to determine how much money communities receive from the federal government for the next decade. This includes funding for schools, health care, food assistance and housing. All it takes is 10 minutes and you can impact the next 10 years here in Macomb County. In August, census employees will be going to homes that have yet to return their data.
