

Schools are officially back in session across Macomb County. Depending on the district, this might mean in-person classes, virtual learning or a mix of both. But as discussed in this newsletter last week, whatever direction is chosen, Macomb County stands ready to assist. We are working closely with district leadership across the county to provide support in a variety of areas - including the distribution of PPE and technical assistance. Our Health Department is also issuing guidance for parents through our 'COVID-19 Back to School Toolkit' here. This resource provides information and details that will help families adjust for the 2020-2021 school year.

Collaborating with schools is just one example of how Macomb County is continuing to respond to the COVID-19 crisis. Macomb County is offering COVID-19 testing for all individuals, businesses, and organizations. No appointment is necessary. The drive-thru site is located at 380 Rose St., Mount Clemens, MI 48043 is open on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. The test is free, no prescription is needed and you do not need to have symptoms to be tested.



Important Things to Know

• Help the Macomb County Health Department reduce COVID-19 outbreaks by answering your phone when they call. Its contact tracing team will only ask you a few questions and your information will be kept confidential.



 Macomb County Planning and Economic Development has opened three new grant opportunities to help small businesses dealing with the impact of COVID-19. Grants include the Microenterprise Assistance Grant Program, which is funded by the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program; the Workplace Safety Grant and the Online Business Connect Program, which are both funded through Macomb County's federal CARES Act allocation. Businesses that previously received grant funding through the Macomb County Sustainability Program are eligible to apply for all three new grant programs, as long as the previous grant money was not used for these expenses. 

- Macomb County leaders and personnel have been on the ground responding to the COVID-19 crisis since mid-March. Here's what has been accomplished so far:


MACOMB COUNTY RESPONSE TO COVID-19
