If you are a business owner and you have not yet received a COVID-19 relief grant from Macomb County, now is your last chance to apply. Details are below.

I am proud to tell you that we are setting records at our drive-thru COVID-19 testing site in Mount Clemens. Offered three days per week, we are testing about 300 people per day with results typically available within 48 hours. And on Tuesdays and Thursdays, we are offering quick and easy flu shots for those who call ahead to make an appointment.

Finally, our Green Macomb program is currently focused on increasing Macomb County's green canopy. And this week, they are reminding us to celebrate trees and the beauty of the season through the "Prettiest Tree Contest." Do you have a local candidate? Important Things to Know

 Macomb County Planning and Economic Development has opened a new grant program to help small businesses dealing with the impact of COVID-19. This is the final opportunity for these organizations to apply for assistance. The grant application process will remain open through November 2, 2020 at 12 p.m. Businesses with 50-500 employees may be eligible for grants up to \$10,000. Businesses with 1-49 employees may be eligible for grants up to \$5,000. Learn more.


